

GREGORY D. SMITH, ESQ., BIO

Gregory D. Smith, [J.D., Cumberland School of Law, 1988; B.S., Middle Tennessee State University, 1985; Special Courts Certification, National Judicial College, 2014], is a Justice on the Pawnee Nation Supreme Court in Oklahoma and the Alternate Judge on the Gila River Indian Community Court of Appeals in Arizona. Each court is the highest appellate court in their respective tribal nations. Both positions are part-time judgeships.

Mr. Smith also has a law practice in Clarksville, Tennessee and is the part-time municipal judge for Pleasant View, Tennessee. Judge Smith has presented between 650–700 appeals for courts all over the United States. He is a former president of the Tennessee Municipal Judges Association and served on the Tennessee Court of the Judiciary from 2004–2009. In 2013, he wrote the Tennessee Municipal Judges Benchbook for the Tennessee Administrative Office of Courts. In 2012, Judge Smith compiled and edited the Tennessee Judicial Ethics Opinions Handbook for the Tennessee Judiciary. Judge Smith has also acted as a special adjunct professor at the Cumberland School of Law at Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama and as an adjunct professor in the field of law at Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, Tennessee.

In March 2015, he was inducted into the National Trial Lawyers' "Top 100" Attorneys for the field of Criminal Law and is regularly included in Who's Who in American Law.
